Thank you for your interest in adopting from us. We are committed to placing each of our deserving equines in safe, loving homes where their needs and your expectations align. Making a perfect match is of utmost importance to us – both for the benefit of the horse and the adopter. Please remember that an equine you may want to adopt may not be suitable for you, and in that case, we will not approve such an adoption.

A few things to keep in mind before you fill out our application:

- Our goal is to make the best match for adopters and our equines. Please fill out the application as fully and honestly as possible.
- Please note that your adopted horse cannot be used for breeding, be re-sold or given away. The horse cannot be relocated from the original approved facility without our permission. There is further legal language in the adoption contract.
- All of our adopted horses must live in an environment with at least one other equine. Horses are herd animals and they require equine companionship.

Once your application has been received, we will set up an interview with you, check your references and schedule an appointment to inspect the property where the horse will be kept. The information will be reviewed and a final decision will be made. Fox Lea Farm reserves the right to deny adoption for any reason at its sole discretion. If you are approved, we will match you with a suitable equine. If we do not have a suitable equine at the time of approval, your approved application will be kept on file. A signed adoption contract and the adoption fee is required for adoption.

We will conduct follow-up visits on the adopted horse and the facility on a minimum annual basis. Upon placement of a horse, Fox Lea Farm may require the adopter to submit health statements from the adopter's veterinarian and farrier should a concern arise.

Again, thank you for your interest in adopting a rescued mini equine. Remember, should adoption not prove ideal, there are many other ways to support our work. Please check out ways on our website.
